services from Cardinia Shire trialed the sustainability plan between July 2020 and June 2023.

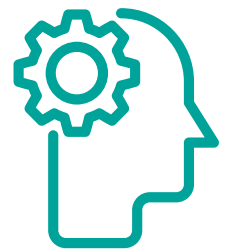
REFLECTIONS FROM SERVICES ON THE SUSTAINABILITY PLAN PROCESS:
